**Finance Report:** Sue Peglow circulated the June finance report by email. Discussion followed about the history of budget allotment for Stonington Magazine production and mailing. Process for revenue requests for additional projects such as Lunch and Learn expenses, program attendance reviewed by chair, Stacy Cassata.

### **Programs/Events**

### a) Stonington Human Services-

Michelle Banks reported on the Town Services.

- The Renters Rebate Program application deadline is September 29<sup>th</sup>. Any applicant that misses the 10/01 deadline can request an extension of time to file by submitting an extension request form along with a letter from a doctor indicating that they have a medical issue that contributed to them not applying during the open application period. The deadline to request an extension is November 15th. Residents can call SHS with any questions, (860) 535-5015.
- Applications for energy costs assistance begin September 15<sup>th</sup>,
- Eastern CT Transportation Corp (ECTC) is available to provide transportation to medical visits.
- Information about Stonington weather-related events and emergencies called Stonington Alerts is being advertised to residents by phone calls and advertisements. Flyer attached.

### b) Other agencies –

### a. Pawcatuck Neighborhood Center:

 Sue Sedensky reported that PNC continues to offer weekly lunch and learns every Thursday at 12noon. She expressed gratitude to member, Dr Chris Morren for his ongoing coordination of senior and health-related programs and speakers which will continue though the Fall schedule. Schedule topics for November/December will include: Preparing for Urgent and Emergent Medical Problems, Legal and Medical Matters, Physical and Occupational Therapy in the Home Setting and Transition from Independent Living to Assisted Living and Institutional Care. Dates to be announced.

- Transportation services have expanded beyond Stonington, No.
   Stonington
   and Westerly to include Norwich, New London, and Wakefield (South County).
- Fall Senior trip planned to Amish country.
- Sue announced that regularly scheduled programs at PNC (art, exercise, etc.) are now free of charge for town resident members.

**Legislative Updates** – Committee member Chris Morren reported that the CT Legislative Session (January-June 20023) is completed. The next session will begin in February 2024.

### **New Business-**

a) Stonington resident and volunteer Liz Stern attended the meeting to share information about a new service for the Commission's consideration called URCommunity Cares. Liz has become aware of the program and investigated its use across the state of CT. The agency is a 501(c)(3) that coordinates at home senior support by volunteers at a reasonable cost. The agency assists CT towns and other organizations with communication and public outreach about services and also performs background checks on all participants. Liz recommended that the COA review the website. Committee members were enthusiastic about pursuing more information from the program manager at a future meeting which Liz will facilitate and will invite relevant town partners such as Human Services. Flyer attached. The lack of affordable housing for seniors came up for discussion. Selectman June Strunk informed the group that CT requires all towns to have 10% of housing designated as affordable and Stonington has 5.7%. She announced a new commission dedicated to the issue called Housing Opportunities which begins meeting this month. Liz Stern is a commission member. She was asked to keep the COA informed as to how it can support their efforts. June also announced that town Zoning Regulations are under revision and will include more information about affordable housing.

Get to know us

UR Community Cares provides a secure website that connects older adults and people with physical disabilities to community-based volunteer support to help them live safely at home. Athome services are offered free of charge, including household chores, yard work, companionship including pick-up/delivery of groceries/pet care, and local transportation (subject to volunteer availability).

Our online match-up system at <u>URCommunityCares.org</u> is a collaborative, self-generating, and self-sustaining solution for interested communities and organizations. People age 70+ and/or 18+ with a permanent or temporary physical disability comprise roughly one-third of every town's population. This sector is growing in size in many towns, presenting new challenges for social services and public safety. Local residents can work together to assist neighbors and help them overcome risks of falling, mobility restrictions, isolation, and loneliness.

We rely on funding such as donations, sponsorships, grants, and municipal budget allocations. Our estimated per-participant annualized cost is \$100/person. This must be addressed in advance in order for us to cover direct program costs (i.e., background checking, website security/software, admin., marketing, operational expenses and insurance coverage). Our goal is to offer services at no charge to participants. Contributions to our 501(c)(3) nonprofit are tax-deductible.

**To participate**, community members will enroll online, can be signed up by a partner or call 860-430-4557, then undergo a background check and then once approved request assistance from the volunteers in town. Volunteers undergo the same sign-up process and then will accept service requests whenever they can (eligibility starts at age 15 and adult consent/supervision is required for 15-17 year olds). Volunteers decide their schedule and the category they are interested in helping in.

**Guided by our Executive Director**, our participation criteria have no restrictions in terms of income, assets, benefits status, race, ethnicity, gender, religion, or sexual orientation.







