- 1) The meeting was called to order at 6:00pm
- 2) Motion was made to approve the minutes of: Jan 10thRegular meeting; Jan17th Special Meeting re Cultural Districts; Jan 3rd and Jan 25th Special Joint meeting re Energy Fair. Motion KB, Second DF, **All in Favor**
- 3) (b) A motion was made to fund up to \$600 towards the cost of a monitor and poster/mural in the Mystic Chamber visitor center that will allow visitors to view EDC's marketing website Stonington1649.com and the Stonington marketing video. Motion KB, Second VA, **All in Favor**
- © We discussed the pros and cons of the Town buying the Circus Lot and agreed to write a letter of support highlighting the importance of economic vibrancy that parks contribute to towns and that the Pawcatuck river is an underutilized asset that at some point could be connected to downtown Pawcatuck by a riverwalk. Motion KB, Second SL, All in Favor
- (d) We discussed updating the mission statement and agreed on a number of words and phrases that could be incorporated into the mission statement; e.g. economic prosperity, vibrant communities, innovative, sustainable, champion, proactive, informing. **Cullen** will take these ideas and put something in writing for us to discuss at our next meeting.
- e. The consensus was we could slim down the information on the Town website to include important information that is not a good fit for the EDC's marketing website, Stonington1649.com. The key information we thought important is: Stonington Town Profile (from Advance CT), Key metrics such as Top 10 Taxpayers, Top 5 employers, Bond Rating, Grand list summary, affordable housing availability. **Dan** will work on cleaning up the layout and the verbiage on the EDC website page.
