

**STONINGTON BOARD OF POLICE COMMISSIONERS
REGULAR MEETING
JANUARY 8, 2015
5:00 PM AT THE STONINGTON POLICE HEADQUARTERS
MEETING MINUTES**

1) Call to Order / Pledge of Allegiance

Chair Olsson called the meeting to order at 5:00PM.

2) Remarks of Visitors

Hartford Marathon Group Proposed ½ Marathon
Steve White, Mystic Seaport President

In attendance to support Hartford Marathon Group's proposed May 31, 2015 ½ marathon. Mr. White stated that the Seaport had concerns regarding the original proposed date of June 28th, and appreciates the Marathon Group taking their concern into account; he believes the concept is great for the area, and would like to work with the crew to make this event successful.

Mr. White also stated that he would like to take this opportunity to make the Commission aware that he supports the proposed Coogan Farm property changes.

a. Coogan Farm – Planning & Zoning Application

Denison Pequotsepos Nature Center Special Use Permit

Chad Frost, Landscape Architect, Kent & Frost Landscape Architecture

Mr. Frost presented plan to Commission; stated that after the last meeting he reviewed the impact of the Commission's motion and came up with a few concerns:

- Restriction of northern driveway as entrance only will impact the Giving Garden, which provides approximately 3-6 tons of food to United Way, and utilizes a box truck that can only exit from that driveway
- One lane connector intended as "glorified pedestrian walkway"; do not have enough room to make it two lanes wide due to existing structures
- If only exit is from the south driveway there is a safety concern, as it forces all vehicles into the same area as the bus drop off zone, as well as where most visitors are walking after parking in the main lot

Still awaiting State DOT comment as well, however hoping to get Commission input tonight

Chair Olsson stated that he does not believe it is appropriate for the Commission to comment prior to receiving State input.

Mr. Frost stated that due to timing, he is concerned as they are under 35 day limit & need to respond to Planning & Zoning by February 3rd.

Vice-Chair Moukawsher explained that if the Commission provides comment now, before Mr. Frost determines what works best for him, he may be committing to something that he later determines is not feasible.

Commissioner Trebisacci asked if Mr. Frost can request that Planning & Zoning grant an extension to the 35 day requirement.

Commissioner Holt stated that even if the Commission makes a decision tonight, the State can overrule that decision. Commissioner Holt suggested tabling Commission input until State comment is received, and to have a special meeting at that point in order to assist Mr. Frost with meeting deadlines.

- A motion was made by Vice-Chair Moukawsher to table Commission input until the next regular meeting, or until such time as the Commission decides a special meeting is in order. Motion seconded by Commissioner Holt, all in favor, motion approved.

Chief Stewart requested that Mr. Frost send list of date requirements.

5) Traffic

- a. Hartford Marathon Group – Request for ½ Marathon

Barry J. Saluk, Mystic Rotary Club

Beth Shluger – CEO, Executive Director of Hartford Marathon Foundation

In attendance to answer any questions regarding proposed ½ marathon.

Ms. Shluger stated that Hartford Marathon Foundation has established a strong partnership with Mystic Rotary. With Rotary's help, all businesses on Coogan Boulevard have been contacted & surveyed about interest in the proposed ½ marathon. Hartford Marathon Foundation is 501c3, made up of race management professionals that stage high quality races; after safety, their priority is to produce an event that brings economic impact and tremendous pride to the community, and it is important to the Foundation that Mystic receives the benefits from race visitors & that their runners get to experience the beauty of the area.

Ms. Shluger introduced Josh Miller, Hartford Marathon Foundation Technical Director and Matt Anderson, Hartford Marathon Foundation Operations Manager.

5) Traffic (cont'd)

a. Hartford Marathon Group – Request for ½ Marathon (cont'd)

Commissioner Holt stated he is concerned about possible bottleneck issue at leg 7; runners will be turning around on Deer Ridge Road.

Mr. Miller confirmed that seven miles into the race there will be no bottleneck issues.

Vice-Chair Moukawsher & Commissioner Holt asked about parking; Mr. Anderson stated they have about 1700 spots; Ms. Shluger stated that most runners will come at least two to a car, and are directed via signage and volunteers regarding where to park; parking directions are provided to all pre-registered runners.

Commissioner Holt asked about the Mystic Drawbridge; Ms. Shluger stated that runners will be across the drawbridge before the first opening at 7:40am, with race starting at 7am, runners will be over the bridge & turning onto Pearl Street at 7:28am.

Chief Stewart stated his biggest concern is when runners are coming back from Groton onto Route 27; this will require 1 lane closure & approximately 5-6 officers.

Commissioner Rotella asked for additional confirmation that all runners will cover the two miles in order to make it over the bridge before its first opening at 7:40am. Ms. Shluger stated that runners are not permitted to participate in the race if they cannot stay under a 15 minute per mile pace.

- A motion was made by Commissioner Holt to approve the Mystic ½ marathon on Sunday, May 31, 2015 subject to approval by Chief Stewart, CT DOT, and provided all necessary paperwork and insurance is in place. Motion seconded by Vice-Chair Moukawsher, all in favor, motion approved.

Chief Stewart noted that next year this race cannot occur on the last Sunday in May, as that is Memorial Day weekend; Ms. Shluger stated that in following years they are hoping to schedule the race on the first Sunday in May.

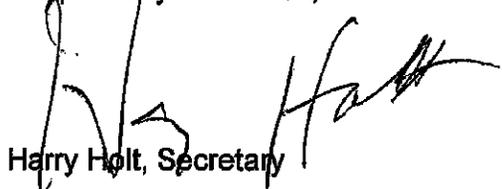
