Call to order 7:03 PM

- Approval of April meeting minutes – unanimously approved
- Richard Olisky discussed the current energy saving outreach opportunities for industry and residential including carbon reducing services, rebates and incentives.
 - The program is run through CT DEEP and governed by the Energy Efficient Board, utilities manage the programs at a reduced rate of \$99 (free if you are less than 60% of the state median income). Only 40 vendors are certified by the utilities and only 3 vendors are east of the CT River.
 - Looking for access to include more outreach into the Stonington community and would like to be part of future community events.
 - Loans are available to increase solar energy for low and moderate income families – currently in Bridgeport but will soon expand to Eastern CT
 - Once a town has reached 100 points, they are eligible for a \$10,000 grants and Stonington currently has 160 points. Can get up to 2 a year for a maximum of \$20,000.
- Discussion continued on incorporating this information for dissemination at future public meetings, website but also a good fit for other town departments.
- Discussion of budget as funds for the task force are still available to support professional development
- Update on the status of the CT Department of Housing Planning grant. Following interviews with the top three firms. A contract is pending with additional information coming. A joint meeting will upcoming with multiple town departments, task force, and boards is being planned
- A meeting is planned to further implement the Emergency Preparedness Grant with UCONN.
- Review of the discussion on the Barn Island Management Plan, it was decided to wait until the first round of comments before responding to the plan.

- Task force will brainstorm a list of organizations that should be invited to upcoming meetings. Additionally, a draft invitation will be created that can be distributed at festivals and fairs.
- Discussion on latest news articles that pertain to climate change and other town initiatives.
