MEETING MINUTES

1) Call to Order/Pledge of Allegiance

Chair Olsson called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m.

2) Remarks of Visitors

3) Remarks of Chairman Olsson

Chairman Olsson congratulated the Pawcatuck Westerly Junior Softball team who came in 7th place at the Junior Softball Little League World Series.

a. Clark Street @ Mechanic Street – Possible Stop Sign Installation

Scot Deledda, Town Engineer, was present to discuss proposed improvements that will be made at the intersection of Clark Street, Mechanic Street and River Road in Pawcatuck. This project is designed by DeCeasare-Bentley and is part of the Thread Mill project. Currently, this intersection is wide on the Clark Street side with a center island that presents itself as more of a yield. New proposed conditions will remove the center island and align Clark Street at a 90 degree angle with Mechanic Street and River Road, which is a more uniform width. Modifications to this project will improve overall conditions as site line will be extended from the sharp curve and the entrance onto River Road will be further over to the right. Construction on the road should take two to three months starting possibly in Spring on 2016 barring any setbacks.

The issue of the most immediate concern is the sight line issue. Speeding around the corner and construction trucks parked on the side of the road, as well as the fence in

front of the mill which makes it hard to see are the biggest problems. A discussion followed on possible solutions to the sight line issue.

Commissioner Moukawsher made a motion to authorize Chief Stewart to post the area of Mechanic Street and River Road at the intersection with Clark Street as a construction, no parking zone as he sees fit. Motion seconded by Commissioner Holt. All in favor, motion approved.

6. New Business

a) Planning & Zoning Request: Mystic YMCA Expansion *VOTE NEEDED*

Keith Brynes, Stonington Director of Planning & Zoning

Attorney Ladwig presented the Commission with the complete traffic study done with regards to this project. There was much discussion regarding the impact that this project, and two other projects previously approved (separately) for this area, would have on Harry Austin Drive at Mason's Island Road and Mason's Island Road at Route 1. Keith Brynes noted that the two other projects were approved – the condominium project in 2005, the office building approximately two years ago – but there has been no activity to start construction. Traffic studies done on these projects found no

significant impacts on intersections and no State Traffic Commission approval is needed.

Commissioner Moukawsher made a motion to move back to Planning and Zoning with comments that the Commission did not see a public safety or parking issue, but did express concern with the traffic flow at the intersection of Mason's Island Road and Route 1. Chair Olsson seconded the motion. All in favor, motion approved.

b) Past Due Alarm Fine – Action Required by Board *VOTE NEEDED*

Chair Olsson recused himself from issue discussions.

Chief Stewart presented the Board with past due false alarm fines incurred by a Stonington resident. After discussion, it was determined that this issue would be handled by Chief Stewart. **No vote or action taken by Board.**

At this time, Commissioner Moukawsher made a motion to open **Remarks of Visitors.** Motion seconded by Commissioner Holt. All in favor, motion approved.

The event ending time will change from 10:00 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. They are asking for the same assistance from the Police Department that they received last year. Chief Stewart said there were no problems last year, good event, recommends approval.

Commissioner Trebisacci made a motion to approve the Mystic Eats food festival scheduled for September 11th 12th & 13th, 2015 provided the insurance and other requirements are met. Motion seconded by Chair Olsson. All in favor, motion approved.

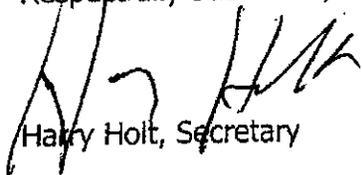
Commissioner Holt made a motion to approve the Consent Agenda. Commissioner Moukawsher seconded motion. All in favor, motion approved.
