Recreation Administrator Ward highlights the second Boating Safety Course is almost full. The Baby Boomers program is negative but he believes it will break even. Chairman Crowley suggests advertising at the Pawcatuck Neighborhood Center to increase participation levels. Zumba Fitness rental costs cause the program to be in the red. Chairman Crowley concerned with low numbers. Girl's basketball, soccer league, men's softball, coed softball and coed tennis are all looking good according to Mr. Ward. Discussion about the golf league's location is still in the works.

Summer plans – Aug 6<sup>th</sup> Yankees/Red Sox trip has 11 tickets sold so far. Break-even point is at 45 tickets. According to Mr. Ward, summer playground staffing appears to be very promising. Summer playground will be fully staffed with 12 full day staff members and 10 half day staff members for a total of 15-20 staff members on hand per day and junior counselors. The number of participants in summer playground is not at the maximum but on target. There was some discussion regarding security during summer playground, emergency plan protocol, restrooms, and garbage disposal issues.

**a. Facilities ad-hoc committee**

The Commission agreed that the ad-hoc committee meeting will take place Tuesday, June 16<sup>th</sup> at 4 PM. The ad-hoc committee will identify projects such as security cameras (near the bathrooms), lighting, making the cross country trail more passable, etc.

Chairman Crowley proposed to advertise exercise equipment. Commissioner Ciriello suggests additional signage or site maps to direct the public to various public spots, i.e. equipment, courts, playground, additional parking, etc. Chairman Crowley also suggests incorporating the exercise equipment with a program, for example a walking club or the senior fitness program. Some discussion was made about possibly shifting the senior fitness and/or zumba outdoors at the pavilions during warm weather to save money on rental fees. **NO ACTION TAKEN.**
