The Stonington Board of Selectmen held a special meeting on this date at the Stonington Town Hall at 2:00 p.m. Present were First Selectman George Crouse and Selectman Mike Spellman. Selectman Rob Simmons was available by telephone. Also present was a member of the press.

Mr. Crouse stated that Harry Boardson impressed him especially when he reached out to the neighbors to get his project done. Mr. Crouse stated that Gardner Young has a lot of experience on the board and he is probably the elder statesmen of the alternates. Mr. Spellman stated that Mr. Rathbun was impressive. He stated that Mr. Gardner Young has earned a full appointment. Mr. Spellman stated that we have two high quality people to put on as alternates to develop for the future. Mr. Crouse stated that talking to the other commission members they like the alternate moving up situation because it is a difficult commission to just jump in and this way you are grooming people for the future. The motion was 3-0 in favor of the appointments. Mr. Spellman stated he wanted to have a motion from the Board and have a proclamation made for both in recognition of Mr. Ben Tamsky and Mr. Robert Mercer for loyal service to the Town of Stonington in the very difficult assignment in Planning and Zoning. Mr. Crouse stated that he concurs. Mr. Simmons also agreed.
