 these areas"

The PZC has concluded that Short Term Rentals (STR) are not regulated by zoning, and have decided that zoning is not the most effective way to regulate STRs, a better approach is through Town Ordinance. - Mystic Harbor Landing proposed condominium development: Greylock representatives will give a presentation on the proposed residential project; Expected Outcome: understand project and any issues / hurdles; consider writing a Letter of Support to the PZC. (POCD 9.1)
- Draft PV-5 Zoning concept for downtown Pawcatuck: Keith Brynes has been working on zoning update ideas for the DB-5 area of downtown Pawcatuck along with Jim Lathrop of Best Energy. A zoning update with contemporized uses will help spur a flow of investment dollars into downtown. *Expected Outcome*: provide Keith a sounding board, contribute brainstormed input, help advance rewrite. (POCD 8.1.5, 10.2.4, supports 10.2.5)
- Branding Stonington through Economic Clusters: Erica Lindberg (Lindberg Designs) and Thomas Mitchell (Literae Communications) have been working on ideas for branding / marketing Stonington. This effort is supportive of the EDC's economic cluster work. Expected Outcome: advance plans to create identity for Stonington through economic cluster framework (POCD 10.1.3)
- Develop a Community Planning Forum series where we bring in thought leaders to talk about "emerging" issues. Expected Outcome: brainstorm list of forum ideas, prioritize and time-phase
