NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Town of Stonington will conduct a public hearing by the Board of Selectmen on Wednesday, March 25<sup>th</sup> at 4:00 p.m. (7:00pm-at 173-South Broad Street, Pawcatuck, CT) to discuss the Fiscal Year 2020 Community Development Block Grant program and to solicit citizen input. This will be a virtual meeting.

Major activity categories are: Acquisition, Housing Rehabilitation, Public Housing Modernization, Community Facilities, Public Services, and Economic Development. Projects funded with CDBG allocations must carry out at least one of three National Objectives: benefit to low- and moderate-income persons, elimination of slums and blight, or meeting urgent community development needs.

The purpose of the public hearing is to obtain citizen's views on the Town's community development and housing needs and review and discuss specific project activities in the areas of housing, economic development or community facilities which could be part of the Town's new Application for funding for the year 2020. The hearing will also review and discuss the Town's prior Small Cities projects including any currently open or underway.

Also, the public hearing will be to give citizens an opportunity to make their comments known on the program and for approval of the Program Income Reuse Plan if applicable.

If you are unable to attend the public hearing, you may direct written comments to the Town of Stonington, Human Services Department, 166 South Broad Street, Pawcatuck, CT 06379 or you may telephone (860) 535-5015. In addition, information may be obtained at the above address between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. on weekdays.

The Human Services Department on behalf of the Town of Stonington anticipates applying for the maximum grant amount of up to \$350,000 under Public Services Activities for the Homeless.

The Town of Stonington promotes fair housing and makes all programs available to low- and moderate-income households regardless of race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, sex, gender identity or expression, marital status, age, lawful source of income, familial status, learning disability or physical/mental disability, or sexual orientation.
