 - Proposals Due: September 30, 2022 Connecticut's Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (DEEP) is seeking grant proposals from municipalities, organizations, and businesses for electric vehicle supply equipment installation projects. Up to \$4 million will be available for grants (funds come from the Volkswagen Settlement's Environmental Mitigation Trust). The program will pay for up to 100% of the cost to purchase, install and maintain eligible light duty electric vehicle supply equipment that will be available to the public at a government-owned property.
