HOME OCCUPATION IMPACT STATEMENT

Each application for a home occupation permit must have residency verification* and an impact statement filed with it. This statement should include the following information: Name, address, and phone number(s) of the applicant; nature of proposed business; typical equipment used in the operation; number of people employed; normal hours of operation; number of customers (trips) per hour; impacts to the neighborhood regarding traffic, noise, parking, lighting, etc.

^{*} Residency verification: State of Connecticut Driver's License plus two (2) recent utility bills or similar documents.

.54 Home Occupation – An occupation, not otherwise permitted in the district, which is clearly accessory and secondary to the residential use of the dwelling and conducted by at least one of the family residing on the premises, and which conforms to the following: (a) the occupation shall be carried on wholly within an enclosed building; (b) not more than 25 percent of the floor area of the principal building shall be employed in such home occupation; (c) all advertising displays for the premises shall not exceed 1-1/2 square feet of area; (d) occupations entailing substantial patronage in excess of five appointments per hour, or which create nuisances, noise, glare, or odor shall not be "Home Occupations." Home occupations may include, but need not be limited to: artistry, dressmaking, teaching, professional office, writing, lawyering, architecture, accounting, or consulting, but does not include businesses such as animal hospital, veterinarian, barber, beautician, auto repair, restaurant, tearoom, massage parlor, tavern, or musician.
