The meeting was called to order at 6:05 p.m.

The Minutes of the 8/19/20 Special Virtual Meeting were approved. Motion: Bill; Second: Cullen. **All in Favor**.

EDC Initiatives #8, #9, #11 – Housing Strategy, Land Bank, Incentivize Workforce Housing. Don Poland of Gorman+York presented the Work Plan for the Stonington Affordable Housing Study and Plan. Two public meetings (dates TBD) and communications campaigns will be conducted. Status reports and EDC participation / input will be a part of the Oct 27, Nov 19, and Dec 17 EDC Special Virtual Meetings. In support of EDC Initiatives #9 Land Bank and #11 Incentivize Workforce Housing, Don (with Susan) will provide.

EDC Initiative #1 – Develop Campbell Grain Lot: A summary the 9/15 PZC meeting review of WinnCos PZC application was provided; the application was approved.

EDC Initiative #2 – Pawcatuck Historic Structure designation. SHPO comments were received. Next step is to schedule a meeting with consultant to assess path forward.

EDC Initiative #3 – Acquire Circus Lot: Kropp began the study to test ground water via test wells and analyze core soil samples especially in vicinity of pump house (fill) on 9/16/20. Results will be available soon.

New Business:

- a) Meeting set for 9/29 to consider restart of Targeted Community Investment (using TIF) subcommittee.
- b) Discussed writing letter of support for applicant on the facts advocating allowance of drive thru at 148 S. Broad Street, Pawcatuck. This letter will also advocate for an amendment to the GC-60 zone allowing drive-thrus by Special Permit. Agreed to write Letter of Recommendation to PZC *Action:* Jim. Motion: Jim; Second: Cullen. **All in Favor.**
- c) Discussed recommendation for 4 EDC-supported CIPs Riverwalk, Circus Lot Acquisition, Wayfinding (all supported with \$1 placeholders by the Town propose to resubmit), and add new CIP in keeping with the overwhelming public support for a Pedestrian Bridge. Motion: Dave; Second: Suzanne. All in Favor.
- d) Hotel / Restaurant outreach Bill volunteered to connect with hotels and restaurants to arrange for their representative to receive Narcan training.
