Attending: EDC – Dave Hammond, Jim Lathrop, Dan McFadden, Bill Hobbs, Virginia Abernathy, Kristine Halleck.

The meeting was called to order at 6:01 p.m.

The Minutes for the 11/20/19 Regular Meeting and the 1/7/20 PRG Committee Special Meeting were approved: Motion: Virginia; Second: Jim; all in favor.

Lisa Konicki of the Ocean Community Chamber presented conceptual drawings for Route 1 Pawcatuck-Westerly Bridge Gateway Project. The EDC indicated support for the concept (conceptual validation of the idea). No actions or decisions.

Old Business – Status Updates of 2019-20 Projects. The following projects were discussed (see table for project status):

a) #3 Circus Lot: Held a 12/14 Cleanup event. Discussed holding a Circus lot-specific Community Conversation, informed by the 1/14 Downtown Pawcatuck Community Conversation. A draft of the Phase 1 Environmental Assessment (EA) as presented by Sally Kropp was reviewed in detail, helping to define next steps. A Motion was made to submit a Recommendation Letter to the Board of Selectmen to include Ph 1 EA results and options analysis. Motion: Jim; Second: Kristine. In favor: Dave, Kristine, Jim, Virginia; Opposed: Dan, Bill. Motion did not carry. Discussion to be continued to the next Regular Meeting where a draft Letter will be reviewed (Jim, Dave to draft).

## **New Business:**

- a) Consider PV-5 amendment update Jim introduced the idea, which was followed by roundtable discussion. Jim to circulate draft and rationale for the next meeting.
- b) Decide date last week of Feb to co-host a partner event with SECT Cultural Coalition (Wendy Bury), plan event **deferred**.
- c) EDC CIP prioritization EDC will refine 3 CIPs included in the DoP package: Pawcatuck River Greenway, Circus Lot, and Wayfinding. These three CIPs are aligned with EDC priorities as reflected by the 11 initiatives.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:10 p.m.
