

REGULAR MEETING MINUTES February 7, 2019 6:30 PM

A regular meeting of the Stonington Shellfish Commission (SSC) was held on this date at Mystic Middle School, 204 Mistuxet Ave., Mystic, CT. Members present were Mr. Alan Banister, Mr. Donald Raffo, Mr. Peter Moore, Mr. John Swenarton; Secretary, Mr. Donald Murphy; Chairman.

- 1) Call to order Mr. Murphy called the meeting to order at 6:32 pm.
- 2) Comments from the public None.
- 3) Review and approval of the minutes of the special meeting on January 23, 2019 A motion to approve the January 23, 2019 minutes as amended (Banister/Moore) carried unanimously.
- 4) Correspondence None.
- 5) <u>Business</u>
 - a) Discuss the water quality testing and status of Stonington's conditional recreational shellfishing areas Outer Quiambaug Cove and East Mason's Island (Area A and Area B) Conditional areas were opened six days only in January (Jan. 14-19) due to two >2" rain events. Results from sampling on January 8, 16, and 28 were all excellent except for two unusually high samples collected on January 16 at Outer Quiambaug.
 - b) <u>Discuss progress toward upgrading the Lower Mystic Harbor shellfish growing waters to Seasonal Conditionally Open</u> Mr. Murphy attended a meeting with representatives from the Mystic Water Pollution Control Authority, the Mystic Plant operator (Suez), and Kristin DeRosia-Banick (DA/BA) to discuss Mystic Water Pollution Control Facility operation, performance standards, and the Management Plan. Steve Plant summarized his discussions with Ms. DeRosia-Banick re: testing/harvesting schedules. A draft Memorandum of Understanding is out for review.
 - c) <u>Discuss a request by CT Culture Oysters to renew license AQP-07-2008-2018 (also known as Clam Point 2) for a parcel in the Mystic River A motion to approve the license renewal for another 10-year term (Banister/Moore) was approved unanimously.</u>
 - d) Commercial Shellfishing Reports Steve Plant reported ongoing stock management activities. Dana Lewis reported he has submitted his application for markers and buoys. Will MacKay reported on his discussion with David Carey, DA/BA regarding shellfish restoration projects and a CUSH project aimed at promoting advanced on-site water treatment (septic) systems. He recommended including restoration objectives in the SSC Management Plan.
 - e) Set permit fees and the regulations for the 2019-2020 recreational shellfishing season Don Raffo provided a report on possible permit fee increases to compensate for declining revenue. A motion to raise all permit fees (including Resident Senior) by \$5.00 (Banister/Raffo) was approved 4-1 with Mr. Murphy opposing. All other regulations will remain the same as last year.
 - f) Review of finances; collections, bills, and remuneration A commercial permit fee payment of \$100 was received from David Motherway. A motion to approve reimbursement of \$69.60 to Alan Banister for mileage to the Annual Shellfish Commission Gathering (Swenarton/Moore) was approved unanimously.

- g) <u>Discuss CT Sea Grant's request for input to a plan for shellfish restoration in Connecticut</u> Tabled.
- h) Review the draft modifications to the Shellfish Commission's guidance for applications and application form to conduct aquaculture in Stonington's waters Mr. Murphy will make some minor modifications and forward the draft to the town attorney for review.
- 6) New Business None.
- 7) Adjournment With no further business to discuss, a **motion** to adjourn (Banister/Moore) was approved unanimously. Meeting was adjourned at 8:23 pm.
