

Naloxone Training and Talk Saves Lives

Is someone you know struggling with opiate addiction?

Would you like to be able to do something in the event of an overdose?

The purpose of this training is to put the opiate reversal agent, naloxone, in the hands of family and friends of individuals at risk of overdose. At the completion of the training, attendees will receive a naloxone nasal spray kit.

Talk Saves Lives is AFSP's standardized, 45-60 minute education program that provides participants with a clear understanding of this leading cause of death, including the most up-to-date research on suicide prevention, and what they can do in their communities to save lives.

Participants will learn common risk factors and warning signs associated with suicide, and how to keep themselves and others safe.

The training will be presented by Carolyn Wilson, GASP Coordinator in collaboration with Stonington Prevention Council.
