



SELECTMEN'S CORNER

Dear Stonington Residents,

We are grateful for all the time and effort put forth by so many people working to improve our community. So many positive aspects of our community are thanks to the efforts of our staff at Town Hall, Human Services, the Transfer Station, Public Works, the Police Department, and Stonington Schools, as well as the work done by hundreds of volunteers who give their time and knowledge to our Boards and Commissions, as well as our local nonprofits. Together, we have all been able to make so many positive contributions within the community.

Below you can find just a handful of these positive moments, along with a few updates we thought you may be interested in.





- 1- Community partners came together in May for a Mental Health Round Table to raise awareness, advocate for change and engage in meaningful dialogue on how we can continue to improve as a community and a State on Mental Health Issues.
- 2, 3 With over 300 people in attendance, the Stonington Veterans Monument was dedicated on June 14, 2023. The monument honors Veterans from World War I and on who call the Town of Stonington home. Visitors at the site can utilize a new technology with their smart device that brings them to the dedicated website. The website allows visitors to view or search a list of over 6,000 Veteran names, watch interviews with local Veterans or learn about the artwork and history of the project. It also allows for names of Veterans to continue to be added over the years. More information can be found by visiting www.stoningtonveteransmonument.org.
- 4- Construction began on the Route 1 Sidewalk project linking the high school with downtown Pawcatuck. The \$1.38 million project was made possible due \$600,000 in Urban Act Funds with an additional \$700,000 contributed by the Town. The project is due to be completed this fall. This local-state funding partnership made this project possible, and we look forward to celebrating this community project once the sidewalks are completed this Fall.
- 5 The Stonington Police Department recently welcomed three new officers to their team at a swearing-in event. They also recognized the efforts of many of our officers during specific events in our community and shared their gratitude for a dedicated retiring officer.

6- Town and School officials came together to celebrate 2023 Stonington High School graduates!

7- A dedication ceremony for the Venture Smith Freedom Site at Barn Island was held in May. The site sign is about a half-mile from the southeast parking area, located off of Stewart Road. Thank you to CT DEEP and all who made this possible.

8 - Solid Waste Department launched yet another new, sustainability initiative aimed at further reducing our waste stream with the plastic film recycling program. Since its inception 2,224 lbs. of film recycling has been collected. The composting program continues to be successful with over 115 tons of food waste diverted from our yellow bags!



9- The community celebrated Stonington Little League's 70th Anniversary

10 – A second in person meeting was held with the CT DOT, Town and Borough staff, Police and Fire regarding the Alpha Ave Viaduct. The DOT emphasized the importance of local partnerships and after hearing concerns raised about the project, came back to the Town with additional options. All participants, including DOT, agreed to fully replace the bridge and no longer close off town roads. The expected lifespan for the replaced bridge would be 75 years and could ensure future generations have lower costs for bridge maintenance and repair. The current timeline would have a draft preliminary design ready for public input in the summer of 2024, with final preliminary designs completed that Fall. A semi-final design should be done



by 2025, with design completion in late summer of 2026. Construction would start in spring of 2027.

11 – Stonington was one of 15 municipalities awarded funding by the Department of Economic and Community Development to help remediate and redevelop vacant and blighted brownfield properties across the state. The Board of Selectmen supported an effort to put forward an application of \$200,000 to conduct assessment activities at the former 5.5-acre industrial site at 21 Pawcatuck Ave to potentially enable residential use. Redevelopment ideas were presented by the developer to Planning and Zoning in early July.

12, 13 – The community came together to celebrate our local fishing fleet, fishing families and those who were lost during the 70th anniversary of the Blessing of the Fleet.





14- A recent meeting to discuss how we can continue to effectively reach as many citizens as possible for emergency notifications occurred with our new Emergency Operations Manager, Captain Schneider and emergency management team including representatives from our Police Department, IT and First Selectman's Office. The Stonington Alerts systems allows us to keep you informed with important information such as emergencies, weather related events, major detours, resources and more. As a reminder, if we can't reach you, we can't alert you! Please take a moment to sign up for Stonington Alerts at www.stonington-ct.gov/home/pages/stonington-alerts

Lastly, after securing \$1.9 million to address a longstanding public safety concern and with a finalized environmental review approved, in August another milestone for the water loop project was completed with a RFQ for engineering and design work underway.

Department of Assessment

The Department of Assessment would like to remind all owners and lessees of tangible personal property that Connecticut General Statute 12-40 requires all persons, both residents and non-residents, to file a sworn declaration of all assets owned as of October 1, 2023 to the Assessor by the statutory deadline of November 1, 2023. The definition of personal property is "property that is not permanently affixed to or part of real estate." This includes, but is not limited to, tangible items such as furniture, fixtures, machinery & equipment, supplies and unregistered motor vehicles. Household furniture used exclusively for personal use is exempt. In September a declaration will be mailed to each owner of tangible personal property on record. If you do not receive a form but own assets located in town, you can request one from the Assessor's Office either via email: assessor@stonington-ct.gov or via phone: 860-535-5098. Forms and more information about the personal property process are available on the town website: http://www.stonington-ct.gov. Declarations clearly postmarked by USPS on or before November 1st will be considered timely filed. Extensions may be granted for just cause if a written request is received on or before November 1st.

The Board of Assessment Appeals will be meeting on Saturday September 16th, at the Town Hall, from 9:00-10:00am to hear any motor vehicle appeals.

The application period for the Additional Veteran's Program ends September 29, 2023. This is an incomebased program with the maximum income for a single person being \$40,300 and for married couples \$49,100.

The 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline is a network of more than 200 state and local call centers funded by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) through Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) and administered by Vibrant Emotional Health. In Connecticut, the Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services (DMHAS) and Department of Children and Families (DCF) fund the Connecticut 988 Contact Center operated by the United Way of Connecticut/211. 988 Contact Center services include rapid 24/7 access to trained crisis contact center staff who can help people experiencing suicidal, substance use and other mental health crises, provide referrals to resources, and perform warm transfers to mobile crisis services or emergency services as needed/ desired. Studies have shown that after speaking with a trained crisis counselor, most people served by the Lifeline are significantly more likely to feel less depressed, less suicidal, less overwhelmed and more hopeful. STONINGTON JUVENILE REVIEW BOARD

A Juvenile Review Board (JRB) is a community-based diversion process for youth that may otherwise be referred to the Juvenile Court for minor violations of the law. Stonington Human Services, in partnership with the Stonington Police Department, work collaboratively to coordinate community-based services to provide comprehensive delivery of prevention, intervention, treatment and follow-up services, included but not limited to: (1) Individual and group counseling; (2) parent training and family therapy; (3) work placement

and employment counseling; (4) alternative and special educational opportunities; (5) recreational and youth enrichment programs; (6) outreach programs to insure participation and planning by the entire community for the development of regional and community-based youth services; (7) preventive programs, including youth pregnancy, youth suicide, violence, alcohol and drug prevention; and (8) programs that develop positive youth involvement. One of the features of the JRB model that sets it apart from other programs designed to assist youth and families, and one of the reasons for its success, is that each IRB program is unique to the community it serves. 
