MEETING MINUTES

1) Call to Order/Pledge of Allegiance

Chairman Moukawsher called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m.

3) New Business

b. Planning & Zoning Special Use Permit Application – Vault Coffee Roasters Coffee Shop *ACTION/COMMENTS NEEDED*

This will be a new tenant moving into an existing site in Olde Mistick Village.

Commissioner Trebisacci made a motion to return this to Planning and Zoning with the comments that the Commission sees no impact on safety, traffic, or parking. Commissioner Holt seconded the motion. No discussion. All in favor, motion approved.

c. Kevin Burns – Dispatch of Wequetequock, Stonington, & Pawcatuck Fire Departments

Kevin Burns was not present at the meeting. Item not addressed.

a. Planning & Zoning Regulation Text Amendment Application – Andrew Rodgers *ACTION/COMMENTS NEEDED*

This is a text amendment application that, if approved, would allow micro-breweries and brew pubs in DB-5, LS-5 and M-1 zones.

Chairman Moukawsher stated that the Commission will need something site specific before they will take any action. Commissioner Gourd applauded Rodgers for filling in the empty spaces and contributing to the economic development in the Town.

Commission returned this to Planning & Zoning with no comment.

4. Old Business

a. Tree – Collins Road, Stonington

Chief Stewart reviewed and met with Mr. O'Callahan regarding the tree at 22 Collins Road in Stonington. Chief Stewart feels that this is not a public safety issue. It's not a high speed area, and the tree looks healthy. He is unsure if the tree warden has been to the property to look at the tree. He will send all correspondence to the Public Works Department. This is considered a closed issue unless the tree warden determines the tree will need to be removed.

5. Traffic

a. Willow Street, Mystic – Wrong Way Drivers *VOTE NEEDED*

Captain Olson has been involved with a complaint involving wrong way traffic on Willow Street. There is adequate signage indicating one way. The reason for this section of Willow Street being one way is to make it easier to direct traffic from events such as the Mystic Art Festival. There is no history of accidents in that area, and offenders are typically from out of town. Captain Olson suggested painting large white arrows on Willow Street just south and west of each intersecting road to better communicate the one way direction.

Commissioner Holt made a motion to paint arrows to clarify one way on Willow Street under the direction of the Chief and Captain. Motion seconded by Commissioner Gourd. Chief Stewart noted that this will not be done until the weather is warmer as the paint won't adhere to the road. All in favor, motion approved.

b. Letter Re: Parking – Corner of Avery Street & Route 1, Mystic

The Police Department and Commission received a letter from a citizen concerned with a parking spot at the corner of Avery Street & Route 1 in Mystic. Chief Stewart met with the business owner who has been parking in this spot for approximately two years. Planning & Zoning was contacted and it was found that this parking spot is on the business property, not Town property. The consensus of the Commission was to take no action.

c. Letter Re: Intersection of Route 27 and Coogan Blvd., Mystic

Chief Stewart drove through area and found that the markings on the road are okay. Drivers may just be unfamiliar with the intersection. FYI.

6. Approval of Minutes for November 12, 2015 Regular Meeting *VOTE NEEDED*

Commissioner Trebisacci made a motion to approve the minutes for the November 12, 2015 regular meeting as presented. Motion seconded by Commissioner Holt. Commissioner Gourd abstained. No discussion. Motion approved.

Quite busy. 113 DWI arrests for this year, 42 drug arrests. 2,600+ motor vehicle stops.

Chief Stewart noted that a bid waiver was received from the Board of Finance to choose a company/service provider for the new phone system.

Outside lighting at Police Department – many evening meetings are held at the Police Department and there are concerns with the poorly lit road due to limited spots in the lot and people needed to park in the shopping center lot next door. A study that was completed shows it will cost approximately \$10,000 to put up two LED lights on each pole. One will illuminate our parking lot. There will be no need to re-wire the poles. The cost will not come from the Police Department budget. Finance Director Jim Sullivan will find funding for the project to be completed ASAP.

Stuff-A-Cruiser event will be on Saturday, 12/12/15 from 9-2.

The swearing-in ceremony for the three newly hired officers will be on 12/21/15. Officer Hewes will start immediately and should be out on his own by February. Officers Souza and Cody will begin at the Academy on 12/31/15. This will bring the Department to full strength with 37 officers.

g. 2016 Capital Improvement Projects Budget *VOTE NEEDED

Chief Stewart presented the 2016 Capital Improvement Budget.

Commissioner Holt made a motion to accept the Capital Improvement Budget for the period 2015-2021 as presented. Commissioner Trebisacci seconded the motion. All in favor, motion approved.

h. 2016/2017 Operating Budget *POSSIBLE VOTE*

Chief Stewart presented the 2016/2017 Police Department Operating Budget. Once presented the consensus of the Commission was to vote on the budget in totality.

Commissioner Holt made a motion to increase the hourly salary of non-union personnel at the discussed rate of 2.6%. Motion seconded by Commissioner Trebisacci. All in favor, motion approved.

As the Commission reached the consensus noted above, Commissioner Trebisacci made a motion to approve the budget in its entirety with variables as discussed. Motion seconded by Commissioner Holt. All in favor, motion approved.

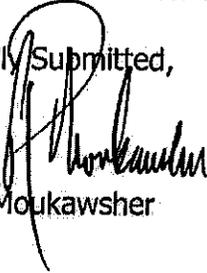
