3) New Business

a. Election of Police Commission Officers

Chairman Moukawsher thanked the Commission for their support and confidence in him.

c. 2016 Regular Meeting Schedule *VOTE NEEDED*

Commissioner Trebisacci made a motion to approve the proposed regular meeting schedule as presented. Motion seconded by Commissioner Holt. All in favor. Motion carried unanimously.

d. Ward Smith, POCD Implementation Committee

Smith, a member of the POCD Implementation Committee formed in September by First Selectman George Crouse, introduced himself to the Commission. As a member of the

POCD Implementation Committee he has sat in on various meetings acting as a liason between the committee and the various boards in Town.

The POCD Implementation Committee has charged the Board of Police Commissioners with two items: bicycle safety signage and relief of traffic congestion. On the issue of traffic congestion, it was noted that the Commission cannot change the configuration of the roads. On the issue of bicycle safety, Chairman Moukawsher feels that direction and input is needed for location and appropriate signage. Commissioner Rotella noted that there is lots of traffic on Route 27, he is not sure it is an appropriate place for tourists to ride with young children. The Commission will entertain requests for signage as they come up. Chief Stewart noted that Officer Kerry Manley has met with a local bicycle company and will be presenting a Public Service Announcement on bicycle safety. This PSA will be more education related than sign related.

In general, with respect to the POCD Implementation Committee/Schedule, the Commission will support what they can support and if there are specific issues they will be entertained.

e. Letter Re: Tree – 22 Collins Road, Stonington *POSSIBLE VOTE*

O'Callahan has purchased 22 Collins Road in Stonington. There is a very large tree at the end of the driveway which presents the need to creep out further onto Collins Road in order to determine if you can safely pull out onto the road. Chief Stewart will reach out to the Director of Public Works and the Tree Warden on this matter. The Commission does not have an issue with Chief Stewart using his discretion in this matter. g. Planning & Zoning Application: Zoning Text & Map Amendment – Stone Ridge *VOTE/COMMENTS NEEDED*

Application is for a text modification. Stone Ridge was opened under a special regulation of congregate living. This permits clinics. Dr. Feltes would like to open a clinic in one of the apartments at Stone Ridge to see resident patients and also patients from outside the facility. The clinic would be open mostly daytime hours initially with one physician and one nurse practitioner. He would like a modification in the requirement that restricts medical clinics to residents and occupants only.

Chairman Moukawsher felt the Commission had a limited role in the application, but had concerns about traffic issues. He would like to see them succeed, but would there be a future impact on traffic if successful. He was also concerned about bringing people in from outside of Stone Ridge. Feltes stated that his hopes are to eventually open office off-site and retain the Stone Ridge site solely for residents.

A motion was made by Commissioner Trebisacci to advise the Planning and Zoning Commission that, after review, Commissioners did not believe there was a public safety issue but did feel that it was important that P&Z give consideration to possible traffic and or parking issues that could develop over time due to increased demand. Commissioners did also express the opinion that approval of the text amendment should limit the use to one office. All in favor. Motion approved.

The proposed date for the Mystic Half Marathon is Sunday, May 15, 2016. This was a very successful event in 2015. There are no changes to the route and postcards have been sent to all residents along the route. This will be the only event at the Olde Mistick Village that day. The number of participants will be limited to 2,000 this year. Chief Stewart noted that a proposal of a large development on Jerry Brown Road will need to be looked at as there may not be an escape route through Stone Ridge and that may change the dynamics.

Commissioner Rotella made a motion to approve the date of May 15, 2016 for the Mystic Half Marathon contingent upon State approval, Groton Town Police approval and provided the insurance and other requirements have been met. The event is capped at 2,000 entrants. Motion seconded by Commissioner Holt. All in favor, motion approved.

At the October meeting, Robin Snelgrove of Pawcatuck requested safety signs be placed of Al Harvey Road as a result of a fatal motor vehicle accident that occurred there in 2014. Chief Stewart said that Officer Kerry Manley is working on a PSA with Snelgrove that will be presented at Stonington High School. Chief Stewart will be meeting with her at some time in the future regarding appropriate signage.

5. Traffic

a. E-Mail Re: Kelley's Pace Road Races *VOTE NEEDED*

Anderson presented the Commission with two races he would like approved. The first race is the Frostbite 5K scheduled for January 9, 2016. The other is the Hare Hope Race, last held in 2013, on a date yet to be determined in March, 2016. Both races will be held to benefit the local non-profit organizations MASH and the John Kelly Memorial. The races will start and end at Olde Mistick Village with an 8am start time. Anderson does not anticipate road closures. Chief Stewart advised Anderson that he would need to hire officers for traffic control for both events.

Commissioner Treblsacci made a motion to approve both events subject to the discretion of administration, insurance and other requirements being met, and payment of officers hired for traffic control. Motion seconded by Commissioner Rotella. All in favor, motion approved.

Anderson will have the date for the Hare Hop Race determined in January.

i. Radio Discussion

Chief Stewart and Commissioner Trebisacci attended the IACP Chief's Conference in Chicago. While there they met with area police chiefs and with Harris Radio. Commissioner Trebisacci feels Harris Radio is putting in an exemplary regionalization effort to improve the radio system, and feels that regionalization is a good goal that the Department should pursue and strive for. A new communication system is needed. The Commissioners were polled as to whether they were in favor of regionalization with all being in favor. Chief Stewart has requested approximately \$750,000 in the CIP Budget for the new radio system and has prepared a letter to Congressman Courtney

for funding. If funding is received the CIP Budget figure may lower. Chief Stewart has prepared a letter to Congressman Courtney for funding. Chief Stewart said that the next step will be to meet with Courtney and area chiefs.

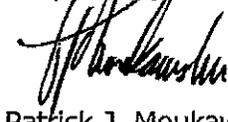
